COURSE DESCRIPTION: This course is offered to state and local law enforcement agencies. It was designed by the IL State Police to prepare the breath alcohol operator for actual operation of the instrument. It will address such issues as laws surrounding DUI arrests, physiology and pharmacology of alcohol in the human body, theories of breath testing, operation of breath test instruments.

This program will be held during a two-day, 16-hour period. Training will be delivered through lecture and practical exercises. Students must achieve 70% on a written examination administered by the Illinois State Police in order to be licensed as a Breath Analyzer Operator. Students may miss no more than 10% of class and still receive a certificate of training. All laboratory assignments must be satisfactorily completed.

Non-Member Tuition: There is no non-member tuition for this class, as it is covered under a grant from Illinois Department of Transportation, through the Illinois Law Enforcement Training & Standards Board.

MTU #10 local member department officers will be given registration preference until seven days prior to the date of class. After that date, registrations will be taken on a first-come, first-served basis, regardless of MTU status. We cannot accept registrations from individual officers. All registrations must go through your Chief, Sheriff, or department training office, even if you are attending class on your own time.

Cancellation: If a class must be canceled for any reason, every effort will be made to do so at least 2 weeks before the class is scheduled to begin. However, there are circumstances where last minute cancellation is out of our control. All officers who have been registered for training will be contacted at the email address given at registration, so please be sure to provide an email address which is checked often.
