This 3-hour course was designed by the U.S. Dept. of Justice to educate and assist police officers in investigating the ever-rising instances of heroin overdoses.

The course will cover:

- How heroin works in the body
- Nature of heroin
- Methods of administration
- How heroin kills
- Signs of heroin use
- Evidence of heroin in body fluids
- Investigation of heroin overdoses
- Processing the crime scene
- Mounting an investigation to target the dealer
- Determining cause of death
- Prosecution of the heroin overdose case
- Potential expert witnesses

Instructor: Don Allegro is Senior Litigation Counsel in the Central District of Illinois. He has been an Assistant United States attorney for 22 years, serving in the Northern District of Florida, Southern District of Iowa, and the Central District of Illinois. Prior to becoming a lawyer, Mr. Allegro was an Infantry officer for five years in the United States Marine Corps and a police officer for over six years with the Los Angeles Police Department.

MTU #10 local member department officers will be given registration preference until seven days prior to the date of class. After that date, registrations will be taken on a first-come, first-served basis, regardless of MTU status. We cannot accept registrations from individual officers.
