Instructor: Lead Instructor Ron Yanor spent 19 years on a multi-jurisdictional tactical team, with 9 years as the training and intel officer. He has operated Adamax Tactical Academy as a full-time training entity since 2010 and has developed several state certified courses in addition to independent courses. With 30+ years' experience in the tactical field, Ron has authored over 50 published articles on training and tactics, and is an adjunct instructor for TEES. Adamax partners with several globally recognized training partners including Tactical Energetic Entry Systems, Direct Action Group, Vickers Tactical and Internal Breacher's Group.

Goals: This course provides police firearms instructors with a fundamental skill set to conduct basic patrol rifle training and sustain a patrol rifle program within their agency. Primary drills are centered on the AR15 platform. The curriculum focuses on instructor development with several practical teaching exercises, both live and dry fire. The course concludes with instructor candidates preparing and conducting an afternoon range session with new novice trainees.

This is not a beginner's course for Patrol Rifle. You must have received prior training on the use and safe handling of a patrol rifle and be able to show your proficiency with the weapon. There will be a mandatory qualification with your weapon on Day 1 to gauge this proficiency. Those unable to qualify or safely handle the weapon will not be allowed to finish the course.

Safety Note: These items are prohibited in the training area for safety: live ammo, magazines, O/C spray, batons, knives, secondary weapons. Please do not bring these into the classroom. THERE IS A MAXIMUM REGISTRATION LIMIT OF 12.

Non-Member Tuition: \$320.00. Non-Member tuition shall apply to State/Federal agencies, and Local Law Enforcement agencies which are not a member of any MTU. Tuition will be invoiced to departments upon course completion. If a pre-registered student from a Non-Member agency fails to attend training, and the agency fails to provide advance notice within 7 days of the start date of that class, the agency will be invoiced the entire amount of the student's tuition.

You may also fill out and submit our online registration form through the website at www.letac.org or call 217-726-7014 to register by phone (be sure to include all pertinent information). MTU #10 local member department officers will be given registration preference until seven days prior to the date of class. After that date, registrations will be taken on a first-come, first-served basis, regardless of MTU status. We cannot accept registrations from individual officers. All registrations must go through your Chief, Sheriff, or department training office, even if you are attending class on your own time.
