**Instructor: Tony Lebron, Retired Master Sgt., Illinois State Police**

**Course Description:** This 40-hour Instructor Development Course will assist participants in developing skills necessary to effectively administer and instruct officers in the Standardized Field Sobriety Testing (SFST) training program. The curriculum addresses the application of basic adult learning theory and the instruction skills needed to deliver the training. Participants will learn how to deliver this specific training program and the basics on how to make effective presentations. Upon completion of the program, participants will be able to provide SFST training to their agencies. Drug Recognition Experts (DRE) attending this training will earn credits toward their DRE Instructor Certification and toward their 8 hours of continuing education.

**Key elements of the subject matter include:**

- \* Knowing adult learning principles and how they relate to effective training;
- \* Applying motivational techniques and presentation skills;
- \* Demonstrating effective questioning techniques and how to handle challenging situations;
- \* Developing and using training aids; and,
- \* The roles and responsibilities of instructors in conducting the SFST training program.

**Participants attending the training shall be required to make presentations in the following areas:**

- \* The concept of general deterrence of DWI, and evidence of the effectiveness of deterrence in reducing impaired driving.
- \* Laws governing DWI and its enforcement within the participants' state(s).

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- \* The concept of detection as a three-phased process, with specific evidence-gathering and decision-making tasks in each phase.
- \* The kinds of evidence of alcohol impairment typically associated with each phase of detection.
- \* Concepts and principles of divided attention (psychophysical) testing.
- \* Concepts and principles of Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus (HGN) testing.
- \* Guidelines for processing suspects arrested for DWI, preparing arrest reports and delivering testimony in DWI trials.

**Non-Member Tuition:** There is no non-member tuition for this class, as it is covered under a grant.
