Course content: This program will cover the following topics:

- Social networks and the information contained in them

- Obtaining IP's, screen names, e-mail headers, Facebook user ID's and cell phone data for investigations
- Writing subpoenas and search warrants for social networking sites
- Laws concerning computer tampering, stalking, computer fraud, identity theft, harassment through electronic communications, sexting, indecent solicitation of a child sexual exploitation of a child, and child pornography
- Computer and cell phone forensics: When is it appropriate to seize these items?
- Differences in charging Harassment through Electronic Communication and cyber-stalking
- When is it appropriate and not appropriate to contact suspects in any of these cases?
- Cell phone applications and how people are using them today

Items Needed: Laptop computers will be provided by Richland Community College.

Non-Member Tuition: \$160.00. Non-Member tuition shall apply to State/Federal agencies, Local Law Enforcement agencies which are not a member of any MTU, Local Law Enforcement agencies which are members of non-reciprocal MTU's (MTU's which do not offer free attendance to local law enforcement agencies outside of their own MTU). Tuition will be invoiced to departments upon course completion. If a pre-registered student from a Non-Member agency fails to attend training, and the agency fails to provide advance notice within 7 days of the start date of that class, the agency will be invoiced the entire amount of the student's tuition.

To Register: Email registration to register@letac.org. You may also fill out and submit our online registration form through the website at www.letac.org or call 217-726-7014 to register by phone (be sure to include all pertinent information). MTU #10 local member department officers will be given registration preference until seven days prior to the date of class. After that date, registrations will be taken on a first-come, first-served basis, regardless of MTU status. We cannot accept registrations from individual officers. All registrations must go through your Chief, Sheriff, or department training office, even if you are attending class on your own time.

Cancellation: If a class must be canceled for any reason, every effort will be made to do so at least 2 weeks before the class is scheduled to begin. However, there are circumstances where last minute cancellation is out of our control. All officers who have been registered for training will be contacted at the email address given at registration, so please be sure to provide an email address which is checked often.
