INSTRUCTOR: Dean C. Alexander is Director of the Homeland Security Research Program and Professor of Homeland Security at the School of Law Enforcement and Justice Administration at Western Illinois University. Prof. Alexander's teaching, research, and speaking activities encompass terrorism, security, and legal issues. He has lectured in ten countries, including to law enforcement and military officials at North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO), U.S. State Department, and National Intelligence University events. Also, he has trained for the Illinois Statewide Terrorism and Intelligence Center, Oregon Fusion Center, Northern California Regional Intelligence Center, Michigan State Police, Milwaukee Police Department, Yuma Police Department, McAllen Police Department, and the Iowa Homeland Security and Emergency Management Department personnel, among others law enforcement entities and professionals.

ABOUT THE CLASS: This in-service training course addresses the complex nature of dealing with sovereign citizens in the United States and the ways in which law enforcement can respond to these citizens. Estimates believe there are several hundred thousand sovereign citizens in the U.S. and they believe the federal government is illegitimate. Dr. Alexander will cover the past, present and future of dealing with these individuals.

The class will cover:

- * Beliefs of sovereign citizens;
- * How to tell if you are interacting with a sovereign citizen;
- * What you should be concerned about when interacting with a sovereign citizen;
- * Typical crimes they have been convicted of;
- * What to do about citizens claiming to be sovereign

Non-Member Tuition: There will be no non-member tuition as this class is covered by a Homeland Security grant.
