Instructor: Youth Mental Health First Aid is offered by local instructors trained and certified by the National Council for Behavioral Health.

Course Synopsis:

- 8-hour evidence-based public education program designed for adults who encounter youth, ages 12-18, who may be experiencing a mental health crisis
- Learn about unique characteristics of adolescent development related to risk factors and warning signs of mental health challenges, substance use, or substance use disorders
- Learn Youth Mental Health First Aid for crisis and non-crisis situations
- Learn steps to connect youth with appropriate professional care and peer/social support
- Each participant will receive a copy of the *Youth Mental Health First Aid USA* course manual

Class Conclusion:

At the end of this course, participants will have learned how to:

- Consider adolescent development, risk factors and protective factors in assessing situations with youth who may be developing or are in crisis.
- Assess youth for risk of suicide or harm.
- Create/apply a 5-step action plan to offer initial help to young people showing signs of a mental illness or who may be in a crisis.*
- Operate with increased mental health literacy so as to decrease negative perceptions surrounding mental illnesses and addictions in youth.

**Youth Mental Health First Aid® does not teach people to diagnose or to provide treatment.*

All registrations must go through your Chief, Sheriff, or department training office, even if you are attending class on your own time.
