Course Description: This course, targeted toward patrol level officers, undercover/drug unit operators, and personnel working in rural environments, is based upon a worst-case scenario and the lessons learned from 9/11. During Hurricane Katrina, normal medical systems were interrupted and law enforcement was called upon to fill in the gaps - at times, under hostile conditions. The same events could occur in the wake of a terrorist assault, natural disaster, or an active shooter.

This is a very physically demanding course. Participants should expect to lift, carry, and drag fellow students.

Self treatment and casualty shooting drills will be taught, along with officer/civilian rescues, as a small team task. Students will also be introduced to advanced first aid skills, the Israeli bandage and Combat Applied Tourniquet. (Students will also receive one of each of these to take with them at the conclusion of class.)

Core topics include:

- * Self Casualty Shooting Drills
- *Self Treatment Drills
- *Live Fire Victim Rescues (1 & 2 man)
- *Victim Assessment & Treatment
- *Vehicle Rescues
- *Using Israeli Bandages

Student Equipment:

- *Duty pistol w/ duty belt, holster, ammo pouch, spare magazine, etc.
- *ammunition (250 rounds)
- *ballistic vest
- *eye & ear protection
- *old clothing (old uniform shirt)
- *squad car (preferred)
