Course Covers: Current status of the law concerning Asset Forfeiture as it impacts Law Enforcement Officers. A complete analysis of the statutory provisions as they deal with Asset Forfeiture. These include the Article 36 Asset Forfeiture provisions; the Cannabis Control Act Asset Forfeiture provisions, the Controlled Substances Asset Forfeiture provisions, and the new Money Laundering Asset Forfeiture provisions. Asset Forfeiture from the perspective of the Illinois State Police will be analyzed. This will include all of the latest forms, lists, and materials provided by the Illinois State Police. Asset Forfeiture will be analyzed from the perspective of the State's Attorneys. This will include a complete list of proposed forms and guidelines that have been produced to guide State's Attorneys in this area. A complete list of Asset Forfeiture case law will be analyzed. These cases have been divided into topic areas that illustrate trouble areas of Asset Forfeiture.
