COURSE DESCRIPTION: This course is designed to certify police personnel as Breath Test Operators and license them under the guidelines set by the State of Illinois Department of Public Health. Students will be trained on all approved breath test equipment, and will receive a complete student manual with valuable reference materials.

The 28-hour course has been shortened, by the IL State Police, to a 24-hour course in response to student comments and suggestions of course instructors. The core curriculum has not changed. However, reducing the amount of review, and with technological advances on the instrumentation, and speeding up test time, 28-hours is not needed. The same material will be covered in the shorter timeframe.

Grant funding has been applied for to cover this course from the Illinois Law Enforcement Training & Standards Board, through the Illinois Department of Transportation.

MTU #10 local member department officers will be given registration preference until seven days prior to the date of class. After that date, registrations will be taken on a first-come, first-served basis, regardless of MTU status. We cannot accept registrations from individual officers. All registrations must go through your Chief, Sheriff, or department training office, even if you are attending class on your own time.

Cancellation: If a class must be canceled for any reason, every effort will be made to do so at least 2 weeks before the class is scheduled to begin. However, there are circumstances where last minute cancellation is out of our control. All officers who have been registered for training will be contacted at the email address given at registration, so please be sure to provide an email address which is checked often. If you are registered for a class and find that you will be unable to attend, please contact our office as soon as possible to let us know. We often have a waiting list for classes and another officer may be contacted to fill your newly vacated seat.
