Pre-requisite: Officers registering to attend this class must have already successfully completed the State of Illinois 40-Hour Crisis Intervention Team Training.

Returning Veteran Issues by Bert Patania

These segments are instructed by the same instructors used for the full 40 hour CITT Certification class.

OBJECTIVE: The goal of this class is to bring these topics to the officers who attended the Basic CITT Certification classes conducted before the current curriculum was revised and updated. Attending this class will bring CITT officers trained prior to 2010 up to date with what officers are learning in the current version of the class.

Funding for this class is being provided by the Illinois Law Enforcement Training & Standards Board.

All registrations must go through your Chief, Sheriff, or department training office, even if you are attending class on your own time.

Cancellation: If a class must be canceled for any reason, every effort will be made to do so at least 2 weeks before the class is scheduled to begin. However, there are circumstances where last minute cancellation is out of our control. All officers who have been registered for training will be contacted at the email address given at registration, so please be sure to provide an email address which is checked often. If you are registered for a class and find that you will be unable to attend, please contact our office as soon as possible to let us know. We often have a waiting list for classes and another officer may be contacted to fill your newly vacated seat.
